**Count nouns** are nouns you can count with numbers.

**Noncount nouns** are nouns you cannot count.

Count Nouns	Noncount Nouns
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>take <b>a/an</b> in the singular, <b>-s/es</b> in the plural.</li> <li>can be used with <b>many</b>.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>do not take <b>a/an</b> and have <b>no plural</b>.</li> <li>can be used with <b>much</b>.</li> </ul>
 <p>a dog      two dogs      many dogs</p>	 <p>work      much work</p>
 <p>an apple      six apples      many apples</p>	 <p>money      much money</p>

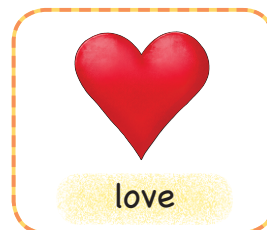
